Mr. Callahan explained that the funds are used for education and to screen children for lead poisoning and to determine the source of lead in children with elevated blood lead levels. He noted that Norwalk has low numbers of lead poisoning in children.

Mr. Bonenfant asked how long the vehicles will last. Deputy Chief Gonzalez explained that they like to get as much as three years on a front line car, but noted that most of the cars are driven 23/7. Chief Kulhawik said that they are trying to get it down to a six year cycle. He said that this was planned out three years ago with Mr. Barron. Mr. Serasis asked about the average mileage per year for a front line car. Deputy Chief Gonzalez estimated between 25 – 30,000 miles.

**DISCUSSION ITEM:**

**1. Update on implementation of body cameras.**

Chief Kulhawik explained that the body cameras for the Police Department have been in use since last fall. The body cameras are issued to a post, and not to a specific officer. He said that there were technical issues with the body cameras, but they worked with the company who agreed to provide them with the newer version of the camera along with a few extras for back up.

Chief Kulhawik said that the officers want to use the body cameras and he hopes to find a way to outfit every patrol officer. He said, however, that the problem is storage for the body cameras. Mr. Serasis said that it is a good goal to outfit each officer.

Mr. Bonenfant said that two people each donated \$25,000 for the body cameras.

Ms. Bowman asked about foot patrol officers. Chief Kulhawik said that he asked the officers, to get out and walk when they can. Mr. Serasis said that he likes the public relations with the Coffee with a Cop. He said that this year he has seen an increased presence of Police officers at his events, in a very community friendly way. He said that the Police officers mix very well with the crowd.

Chief Kulhawik said that he gives credit to Lt. Blake. He said that Lt. Blake and Sgt. Galino come to him with new ideas.

Chief Kulhawik said that when they interview new Police officers, they look for officers who will fit in and not hire enforcers. He said that the new Police officers are assigned to Community Policing.

Chief Kulhawik said that the Citizen's Police Academy will start in September.



**STATEMENT OF THE PROBLEM AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Alcohol-impaired driving fatalities in Connecticut averaged 107 per year for the 2004-2013 ten year period. The year 2011 had the lowest reported total (94) and the year 2013 had the highest reported total (126).

Alcohol-impaired driving fatalities for the latest available three years are: 2011 - 94, 2012 - 100, 2013 - 126.

Alcohol-impaired driving fatalities for the 2004-2013 ten year period averaged 38% of total fatalities for the period.

"Under the Influence" crashes for the latest available three years are: 2012 - 2225, 2013 - 2257, 2014 - 2199.

"Under the Influence" injuries for the latest available three years are: 2012 - 1067, 2013 - 1022, 2014 - 1041.

73% of fatally injured drinking drivers (BAC  $\geq$  0.01) occurred in crashes between the hours of 8 PM and 6 AM.

The number of statewide DUI arrests for the latest available three years are:

FY 2012/2013 - 11,014, FY 2013/2014 - 10,308, FY 2014/2015 - 10,438.

**NOTE:** For DUI Patrol activities, the number of enforcement officers allowed per vehicle at any one time is one per vehicle, however, core enforcement hours may be split by more than one officer. All officers who will be assigned to DUI activities have to be updated in the most current version of Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST).

**NOTE:** The operation of this Traffic Enforcement Program shall be above and beyond the normal/special patrol activities scheduled during the program parameters.

**OBJECTIVES**

To reduce the number of crashes, injuries and fatalities from impaired driving through increased high-visibility DUI enforcement activities. Communicate with the public, through media venues, the increased levels of DUI enforcement activities so drivers will realize the risks and consequences of operating a vehicle while under the influence and therefore deter that behavior.

**ACTIVITIES AND PROCEDURES**

This program is being offered on an expanded year-round basis and is in line with the goals and objectives as highlighted in the Connecticut Highway Safety Plan for FY 2017. Funding will be used to address various circumstances in which increased drinking and driving within the municipality is anticipated to take place. In the course of discussions with police agencies, it is evident that the incidence of impaired driving increases at certain times of the year in addition to holiday periods; for example, shoreline communities which have an increase in population during the summer months. Events such as summer festivals, country fairs, music concerts, sporting events, etc, all represent potential for a higher incidence of impaired driving.

Enforcement techniques employed should include extra DUI patrol activities, and may include DUI sobriety checkpoints. A checkpoint is defined as, an operation not to exceed eight officers, including a supervisor, conducted at a fixed location, which lasts no more than eight hours where operators are stopped and interviewed to determine if the operator is impaired. Roaming or saturation patrols will not be conducted or reported as checkpoints.

The City of Norwalk in 2014 saw an increase in DUI crashes, related fatalities and injuries, reflective of the state wide increases, with the exception of crashes where the state average decreased. Norwalk also had a slight increase in DUI arrests in 2014 but a slightly lower number of arrests in 2015. An increased focus in enforcement effort will be one goal of the 2016/2017 enforcement period.

In the past year Norwalk has seen a revival in its restaurant and bar scene, fed by a significant increase in the availability of new apartments in the two central urban areas, SONO and Waypointe. With thousands of new apartments and residents the attractiveness of the vibrancy of the area brings more people from the surrounding area, most driving from out of town. The new restaurants are smaller with bars that cater to an after dinner drinking crowd, mostly millennials and college students. The mix of more urban residents, more restaurants and bars, and the current climate of law enforcement has led to an increase of demands on officers with a decreased ability for the regular patrol officers to focus on DUI enforcement. The weekend has the highest demand for police services at a time when DUI related crashes have the highest rate of occurrence. In 2014 it was on Friday and Saturday nights when 28 out of 51, or 54% of the DUI related crashes occurred.

Police overtime expenditures are always worrisome to the police and city's administrations. The 75% reimbursement for the DUI enforcement hires has always been welcomed and approved by the Common Council as a way of expanding police services to the important area of protecting lives by way of enforcement.

Approximately one third of the annual total of DUI arrests made by Norwalk officers are through the grant overtime hires. Three Norwalk officers have received recognition from MADD for their contributions to officer training as well as for being responsible for 53% of the 172 DUI arrests in 2015. The grant funding would allow the Norwalk Police Department to continue with an enforcement effort with goals to increase DUI related arrests, decrease DUI related crashes, decrease injuries to both intoxicated drivers and innocent drivers and pedestrians.

DUI checkpoints have been scheduled for the start of the winter holidays, Easter break and the start of summer to bring public notice to the DUI enforcement effort and to remind motorist to not drink and drive. Previous attempts to conduct the checkpoints on actual holiday weekends had disappointing results. The entire proposed schedule was completed after consulting with the Department's top 6 DUI enforcement officers. The Chief also now has the prerogative to choose which officers will be hired with overtime for DUI enforcement (up to 40% of the grant funding), which may also result in increased enforcement.

DUI selective enforcement will be conducted during the Thanksgiving/Christmas/New Year's holiday, Memorial Day/July 4th holiday and Labor Day holiday high travel periods per schedule listed below. Enforcement techniques should include extra DUI saturation patrols, (including DUI checkpoints), on those days that the law enforcement agency determines to hold the highest impact for traffic volume and potential contact with the motoring public as it relates to their community. Funding consideration will be predicated upon several factors including holiday period participation, the municipalities DUI statistics, participation in Click It or Ticket WAVE activities and participation in the Law Enforcement Challenge.

**NOTE:** For DUI Patrol activities, the number of enforcement officers allowed per vehicle at any one time is one per vehicle, however, daily shifts may be split by more than one officer. Agencies working under these DUI enforcement activities will be required to develop and implement a training schedule for traffic personnel to be trained in the most current methods of Standardized Field Sobriety Testing.





You may contact the person to whom this proposal is submitted for assistance in obtaining a copy of those regulations.
5. The prospective lower tier participant agrees by submitting this proposal that, should the proposed covered transaction be entered into, it shall not knowingly enter into any lower tier covered transaction with a person who is proposed for debarment under 48 CFR Part 9, subpart 9.4, debarred, suspended, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this covered transaction, unless authorized by the department or agency with which this transaction originated.
6. The prospective lower tier participant further agrees by submitting this proposal that it will include the clause titled "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion—Lower Tier Covered Transaction," without modification, in all lower tier covered transactions and in all solicitations for lower tier covered transactions. (See below)
7. A participant in a covered transaction may rely upon a certification of a prospective participant in a lower tier covered transaction that it is not proposed for debarment under 48 CFR Part 9, subpart 9.4, debarred, suspended, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from the covered transaction, unless it knows that the certification is erroneous. A participant may decide the method and frequency by which it determines the eligibility of its principals. Each participant may, but is not required to, check the List of Parties Excluded from Federal Procurement and Non-procurement Programs.
8. Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records in order to render in good faith the certification required by this clause. The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.
9. Except for transactions authorized under paragraph 5 of these instructions, if a participant in a covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is proposed for debarment under 48 CFR Part 9, subpart 9.4, suspended, debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal government, the department or agency with which this transaction originated may pursue available remedies, including suspension and/or debarment.

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*Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion—Lower Tier Covered Transactions:*

1. The prospective lower tier participant certifies, by submission of this proposal, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any Federal department or agency.
2. Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such prospective participant shall attach an explanation to this proposal.


