Mr. Hilliard opened the meeting at 7:21 p.m. and noted that there was not a quorum present.

Ms. Biagiarelli explained that there were two months of claims, but none were over \$10,000 and therefore no vote was needed. She referred to the memo in the packet explaining why she attends these meeting. She said that she provides a narrative as well as a monthly tax collection report. The narrative explains what they are working on or if there are any current enforcement issues.

Ms. Biagiarelli reviewed the narrative on tax collections and the monthly tax collector's report. She said that they were slightly behind last year's collections. All of the tax bills will go out on Monday and people will have until February 1, 2011 to pay their taxes.

Ms. Biagiarelli said that they are working on the tax sale. She said that they sent out one letter and as a result, collected \$368,000. Ms. Biagiarelli said that they are going to be doing more enforcement with the Health Department. In addition, they just did wage garnishments for Board of Education and City employees for past taxes.

Mr. Kydes joined the meeting at 7:28 p.m.

Mr. Igneri joined the meeting at 7:30 p.m.

Mr. Hilliard announced that a quorum was now present and went to the beginning of the agenda.

**The following two items were sent to Parks & Recreation Committee
from the OCTOBER 13, 2011 Finance Committee meeting. The license
reader system was unanimously approved and returned.**

Mr. Moccia explained the item. He said that there was capital money to replace the benches at Veteran's Park, but the public wanted to see the master plan before anything was done there. He said that he would like to move \$25,000 of that money to fund the license reader system at the Beach.

Mr. Moccia described the history of the distribution of beach stickers. He said that people work and can't come to City Hall to get their stickers during regular business hours. In addition the parking is very difficult, with 48,000 people coming in to get their passes. He said that he was given the task to administer the stickers without a budget and started working on this system in January.

Mr. Moccia said that the Parks and Recreation Committee approved a vendor and IT has \$30,000 in their budget for this project. He said that if a resident's taxes are up to date, they can register their license plate on line and print their pass. The card reader system will read the license plate. A non-resident will be able to pay at the gate. Last year, over \$200,000 was taken in at the gate. This system will also allow people to pre-register for parking at special events. Residents with leased vehicles will be able to register their license plates on line and print their passes. Passes can also be printed at the Senior Center and at the libraries.

Test cases were done and there were no issues. This has to be done as soon as possible and cameras will have to be installed at Calf Pasture and Veteran's Park. Public Works is going to purchase the same cameras for the Transfer Station. Ms. DelVecchio said that there will be one data base. Mr. Igneri asked if there would be a discount because of both departments buying the cameras. Ms. DelVecchio said that they will be sure to negotiate the cost.

This system will read the front plate only. It is illegal to not have a front plate. Motorcycles will have to be checked manually.

Mr. Pena asked if there was a system in place to prevent people from replicating their passes. Mr. Moccia explained that the pass can't be given to anyone else, because the reader, reads the license plate and not the pass.

Mr. Igneri asked if each car gets a pass. Ms. DelVecchio explained that each car gets a pass. When the resident registers they are asked to provide their license plate number, VIN number and a description of the car. Mr. Pena asked if there were any consequences if someone tries to replicate a pass. Mr. Moccia said that the Police will be called for theft of service.

Ms. DelVecchio said that another benefit of this system is that they will be able to ask residents for their e-mail addresses. That will give Mr. Moccia an opportunity to inform them about events or beach closings. The system will also create reports letting Mr. Moccia know how many people visit the beach and when.

Mr. Moccia noted that Westport charges \$425 for each residential vehicle. Our beach is nicer and is free to the residents.
