## **Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus**

**(Norwalk, Conn.)** - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at [ct.gov/coronavirus](https://ct.gov/coronavirus). Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are six new positive cases in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,014. There were no new deaths reported.
- Mayor Rilling will be joined with faith and community leaders on Wednesday, June 3, at 7 p.m. to discuss George Floyd, protests in Norwalk, and building community relationships. The Town Hall will be broadcast on Zoom and simulcast on YouTube. No registration is required.
- Attorney General William Tong and the Connecticut State Police today released a Public Service Announcement encouraging residents to fact check the information they receive about the COVID-19 pandemic. With people searching for facts and updates on COVID-19, scam artists insert themselves by sharing false information. More details available at [ct.gov](https://ct.gov).
- The “Talk It Out” line for parents and caretakers coping with stress and increased needs from caring for children during the COVID-19 crisis is still available. Call 1-833-258-5011 or visit [talkitoutct.com](https://talkitoutct.com) for more information.
- City officials remind local businesses that an outdoor dining permit is required when using either public or private property. Businesses found operating without a permit will be subject to penalties. Visit [norwalkct.org/covid19businessresources](https://norwalkct.org/covid19businessresources) for FAQs and the application.
- The City will observe a National Day of Mourning & Lament in honor of the more than 130 Norwalk residents and 100,000 lives lost across the country COVID-19. Mayor Rilling asks the public to observe a three minute moment of silence and reflection tonight at 7 p.m.


“The lives lost in Norwalk and across the country in only a matter of months due to COVID-19 is staggering and tragic. I urge those in Norwalk to take a few minutes this evening to hold a moment of silence, reflect on the times in which we find ourselves, honor those we’ve lost, and hope for a brighter future,” Mayor Rilling said. “Yesterday’s protest in Norwalk was impactful with hundreds rallying together to send a clear message. This however cannot be a one-day event, and these hard conversations must continue. I look forward to continuing that dialogue Wednesday night with faith and community leaders. I hope the public will join us for this meaningful Town Hall.”


## Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
