Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 10, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are three new positive cases in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,051. There were no new deaths reported.
- The Norwalk Police Department will resume fingerprinting services on Tuesday, June 16, by online appointment only. No walks-in are allowed, and face coverings must be worn inside the Police Department. For more information or to make an appointment, visit norwalkct.org.
- The Norwalk Tree Alliance planted a Red Oak Tree this morning on the grounds adjacent to the cemetery at St. Paul's on the Green in remembrance of Norwalk residents who have died from COVID-19.
- Anyone who has been furloughed or laid off during the COVID-19 pandemic, and subsequently lost health insurance, may be eligible for coverage through Access Health CT. A Qualifying Life Event allows someone to apply for coverage, but generally there is a 60 day window to apply. Visit AccessHealthCT.com for more information.
- The Connecticut Department of Public Health released an [order](#) ensuring that people with disabilities have reasonable access to support personnel in hospital settings in a manner that is consistent with disability rights laws and the health and safety of patients, health care providers, and support persons.


“I am pleased to see that cases continue to trend down. People continue to wear face coverings and physically distance, and that is helping control this virus. I ask that we all continue to take precautions and follow the necessary guidelines to keep the community safe and healthy,” Mayor Rilling said. “With Phase Two reopening scheduled a week from today across the state, my team and I are reviewing the Reopen Norwalk Plan. We are looking to revise the plan in order to provide more amenities and further loosen restrictions at our municipal parks and facilities. That Plan will be released in detail later this week.”


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
