Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 6:00 p.m. on Friday, June 12, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are four new positive cases in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,056. There were no new deaths reported.
- The *How We Feel* app is a way for residents to anonymously provide scientists with health information needed to understand the spread of COVID-19. The app is free to download in the [Apple App Store](#) and the [Google Play Store](#) and does not require logging in or sharing personal details, such as name or email address. Data can also be entered online at howwefeel.app.
- The Norwalk Parking Authority announced that it will resume normal parking enforcement on Wednesday, June 17 to coincide with the State of Connecticut Phase Two reopening.
- Governor Ned Lamont announced that as the state prepares to enter phase 2 of its reopening efforts resulting from the global COVID-19 pandemic, the [CT Back to Work Initiative](#) is launching and will provide workers and businesses in Connecticut with high-quality, user-friendly career tools to assist those who have been impacted by the economic fallout from the public health emergency. All of the components of the initiative can be accessed online by visiting ct.gov/coronavirus and clicking the link labeled “*CT Back to Work Initiative*.”
- Strict enforcement continues at Norwalk parks and beaches, with nonresidents being ticketed and towed for being parking in resident-only spots. More than 50 vehicles have been towed over the last month. Residents are asked verify their license plate information at norwalkct.org/passes before going to the beach this weekend.


“Checking in on the *How We Feel* app is quick, easy, and totally anonymous. Reporting if you have any symptoms gives scientists an idea of possible spread or flare ups of COVID-19. I encourage residents to use the app,” Mayor Rilling said. “We’re closely monitoring and strictly enforcing parking rules and capacity at our parks and beaches. It is imperative residents verify their license plate information ahead of time to avoid getting ticketed. Please, take a minute today to check your information online before heading out over the weekend.”


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
