Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 21, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are no new positive cases in Norwalk, and the total positive reported cases remains at 2,065. There were no new deaths reported.
- The State of Connecticut has received an extension from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for approval to apply for reimbursement for statewide emergency feeding efforts until July 20. These vital efforts will continue to be coordinated by the Connecticut Department of Agriculture in partnership with the many state and local agencies and nonprofit providers, including community food banks.
- Starting tomorrow, the walk-up window at City Hall will be open Monday - Friday 9 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. as part of the City's Phase Two reopening plan. The walk-up window can be used to drop off or pick up documents, pay taxes, and get help with a parks parking or disposal pass. - COVID-19 community testing is now available at the Day Street Community Health Center, 49 Day Street in Norwalk, Monday - Friday, 9:00 - 1:00 p.m. No appointment is needed and testing is free with or without symptoms. This week, mobile testing will be held at Roodner Court, 261 Ely Avenue, on Monday, June 22 from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and at St. Paul's on the Green, 60 East Avenue, on Thursday, June 25 from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. More information is available at chc1.com.
- The U.S. Census Bureau is monitoring coronavirus closely. City officials ask those living Norwalk to complete the Census online, by phone, or by mail. To date, the national response rate is about 61.6%, and in Connecticut, 64.9%. In Norwalk, the response rate is at 63.8%. View results as they come in at 2020census.gov.


“Having testing more available for the community is a good thing. I appreciate the Day Street Community Health Center working with us on finding mobile spots across Norwalk that puts resources closer to residents. I encourage the public to get tested for COVID-19 even if they do not have symptoms,” Mayor Rilling said. “The 2020 Census will help determine funding for schools, roads, and even community health clinics. Despite the current pandemic, the census continues to move forward. It is critically important that everyone living in Norwalk get counted. Please, complete the 2020 Census today.”


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
