Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 28, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are four new positive cases in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,079. There were no new deaths reported.
- The U.S. Census Bureau is monitoring coronavirus closely. City officials ask those living Norwalk to complete the Census online, by phone, or by mail. To date, the national response rate is about 61.7%, and in Connecticut, 65.1%. In Norwalk, the response rate is at 64.0%. View results as they come in at 2020census.gov.
- The Norwalk Public Library is hosting a free job search webinar on Wednesday, July 1 at 12 p.m. Job search strategy expert Noelle Gross will explain what coronavirus means for a job search and what to focus on in these uncertain times. Visit norwalkpl.org for more information and to register.
- Meal distributions continue this week, but sites will be closed on Friday for the Fourth of July Holiday. Additional food will be provided on Thursday, July 3. Visit norwalkps.org for more information.




Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
