## Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

**(Norwalk, Conn.)** - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at [ct.gov/coronavirus](https://ct.gov/coronavirus). Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 29, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are two new positive cases in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,081. There were no new deaths reported.
- Governor Lamont announced today a plan to provide emergency assistance to renters, homeowners, and residential landlords impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency, including \$10 million for rental assistance, \$10 million for mortgage relief and extends the residential eviction moratorium to August 25. - June 30 is the deadline for small businesses to apply for Paycheck Protection Program loans. Businesses should visit [sba.gov](https://sba.gov) to apply or for more information.
- While the Norwalk Public Library remains closed to the public, staff is available Monday - Friday 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. to offer assistance and answer questions. The Library Helplines can be reached at 203-899-2780 (Main Branch) 203-899-2790 ext. 15902 (SoNo Branch.) Emails will continue to be answered as soon as possible at any time.
- While the traditional Norwalk Summer Concert Series has been canceled due to COVID-19, the City is taking the experience online. Starting this Friday, July 3 at 7 p.m., the Recreation and Parks Department will hold free summer concerts broadcast live on Facebook and YouTube. 


## Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
