Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 4, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are two new positive cases in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,084. There were no new deaths reported.
- Summer School for Norwalk Public Schools begins this Monday, July 6. There are strict health and safety guidelines in place to protect students and staff who are reporting for in-person lessons. Families or students are asked to contact their school principal or office with any questions.
- COVID-19 community testing is available at the Day Street Community Health Center, 49 Day Street in Norwalk, Monday - Friday, 9:00 - 1:00 p.m. Appointments are encouraged and testing is free with or without symptoms. More information is available at chc1.com.
- Due to COVID-19, the City moved the camp experience online. While in-person outdoor activities remains possible for August, starting Monday, July 6, the free online camp starts. It is open to all ages and interests. A list of classes, supplies to use at home, and more, can be found at norwalkct.org/recreationandparks.



We’ve developed programming for all ages and interests, and will help exercise both body and mind. I hope the young and young at heart will give the programs a chance. I think everyone will be pleasantly surprised with what we have to offer starting July 6,” Mayor Rilling said. “With Summer School starting on Monday, I ask the public to be cautious on the road. Buses will be out, and some students may be walking, so please, use extra caution and watch the road when driving.”


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
