Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 5, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are no new positive cases in Norwalk, and the total positive reported cases remains at 2,084. There were no new deaths reported.
- The U.S. Census Bureau is monitoring coronavirus closely. City officials ask those living Norwalk to complete the Census online, by phone, or by mail. To date, the national response rate is about 61.9%, and in Connecticut, 65.3%. In Norwalk, the response rate is at 64.2%. View results as they come in at 2020census.gov.
- Parents and caregivers are reminded that school physicals and vaccinations should not be skipped during the COVID-19 pandemic. Families are encouraged to call their pediatrician, and if they do not have one, to call 2-1-1 to find a local provider for these services.
- The Norwalk Public Library will begin Sidewalk Service on Tuesday, July 7. The service will be available at both the Main and SoNo Branches. Patrons will be able to reserve books and materials and then pickup curbside in safe manner. More details will be available at norwalkpl.org.


“It is so important for children to get a checkup and if they are not already, get caught up on vaccines. Following the regular vaccine schedule and having a physical will make sure students are ready for sports or school, and will help keep them healthy,” Mayor Rilling said. “As we continue to see cases remain steady in Norwalk, we are moving up the curbside pickup at the library a few weeks. I know the public is eager to get their hands on some books, movies, and other materials, and I am happy that we will be able to provide that service this week.”


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
