Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(NORWALK, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at www.ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 1 p.m. on Friday, July 10, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are four new positive cases in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,097. There were no new deaths reported.
- Governor Lamont encourages Connecticut residents to sign up for *CTAlert*, the state's emergency alert system, which provides text message notifications to users. To subscribe, text the keyword COVIDCT to 888-777.
- Tropical Storm Faye is impacting our region right now, and Norwalkers are urged to take safety precautions. Importantly, do not walk or drive through areas that have become flooded by heavy rains. Even after this storm moves through the region, the Office of Emergency Management urges residents to prepare for hurricanes and future storms: make a plan, gather emergency supplies, prepare your car and home, and stay informed of weather alerts. The City's CodeRED Emergency Alert Notification System is a great way to stay informed in any emergency (sign up at norwalkct.org/codered). Find more details about preparing for hurricanes at CDC.gov.
- Starting Monday, July 13, the walk-up service window to the left of the City Hall main entrance will adjust its procedures to better meet the needs of Norwalk residents. The window will be available for Recreation and Parks business on Monday through Friday from 9 am to 12 pm only. The window will be open for in-person tax payments Monday through Friday from 9 am to 4:30 pm. This will allow the Tax Collector's office to utilize both windows in the afternoon. Cash is not accepted at the window.


"Tropical Storm Faye is a reminder that hurricane season is upon us," Mayor Rilling said. "Please stay safe tonight and follow recommendations of our Office of Emergency Management and other officials: secure items around your home that could blow away, prepare for power outages, and do not drive through flooded roads. These and other storm safety measures are important today and throughout hurricane season."


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
