Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 23, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are no new positive cases in Norwalk, and the total positive reported cases remains at 2,116. There were no new deaths reported.
- Mayor Rilling [visited](#) the Day Street Community Health Center, located at 49 Day Street in Norwalk, today to thank staff for their hard work and take a COVID-19 test to demonstrate the process. The test is easy, available to anyone, and free. Walk up or drive up testing is available at Monday-Friday 9 a.m.-1 p.m. More details on testing can be found at chc1.com.
- Norwalk Public Schools and the Reopening Task Force is working on plans to ensure the safety of students and staff. A video update is available in [English](#) and [Spanish](#) on the Norwalk Public Schools YouTube [Channel](#).
- Residents are reminded to verify their license plates before heading to the beach. Mayor Rilling has restricted non-resident access to the beach on Saturdays and Sundays through October 15, and residents still must verify their information, otherwise they may not be able to access the beach. If a car is not showing valid in the online system, the website will provide the next steps. Visit norwalkct.org/passes for more information.


“There are resources available in Norwalk for residents to get tested for COVID-19. The process is simple and results are provided within a few days. I encourage those who may have been exposed or believe they have symptoms to get tested and self-quarantine until the results come back,” Mayor Rilling said. “I ask residents to take a moment today to check online to ensure their vehicle is valid in our system. It only takes a minute and our staff is available to help. It looks like a hot and humid weekend once again, and I do not want to see any Norwalk resident who wishes to use the beach turned away this weekend.”


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
