**Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus**

(NORWALK, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 5 p.m. on Tuesday, July 28, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are no new positive cases in Norwalk, and the total positive reported cases remains at 2,123. There was one new death reported. Now, a total of 145 residents have died from Coronavirus.
- Dr. Alexandra Estrella, Norwalk Public Schools Superintendent, is hosting a virtual town hall meeting tomorrow evening, Wednesday, July 29<sup>th</sup>. She will provide an update on the fall reopening plan, including health & safety, academics, transportation, afterschool and more. There will be two sessions, one in English at 5:30 PM and one in Spanish at 7 PM. Visit [facebook.com/norwalkPS](https://facebook.com/norwalkPS) for more information.
- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the City has canceled its in-person Summer Concert Series and has moved it online to help ensure the health and safety of performers and the audience. The final "backyard" Norwalk Summer Concert Series, A Night With Elvis featuring Patrick Perone, is tomorrow, July 29, at 7 p.m. Visit [facebook.com/norwalkrecreation](https://facebook.com/norwalkrecreation) to tune-in.
- Today, July 28<sup>th</sup>, the State of Connecticut added Illinois, Kentucky, Minnesota, Puerto Rico, and Washington, D.C. to the Regional Travel Advisory. States with a daily positive test rate higher than 10 per 100,000 residents or a 10% or higher positivity rate on a 7-day rolling average are added to the advisory. - The Connecticut Department of Motor Vehicles announced yesterday that it has added to its list of extended deadlines for residents with expiring credentials. Eligible DMV credentials that expire between August 1, 2020 and September 30, 2020 are automatically covered by this extension. Late fees associated with eligible expired credentials will be waived during this time period of the extension for qualifying credentials. More information can be found [here](#).




### Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
