Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(NORWALK, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at www.ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 2 p.m. on Friday, July 31, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there was one new positive case reported in Norwalk. Despite this new case, the current total positive reported cases in Norwalk is 2,125, because the state is continually de-duplicating data and correcting inconsistencies in the statewide database. There were no new deaths reported.
- Earlier this week, Governor Ned Lamont announced the launch of business.ct.gov, an online resource for entrepreneurs and business owners to help with starting or managing businesses in Connecticut.
- Norwalk Public Schools continues its Summer Meals program providing free breakfast and lunch at many sites around the City, Monday through Friday, noon to 2 pm. Grab and Go breakfast and lunch is available for anyone ages 2 to 18. Weekend meals are available on Fridays. No paperwork is required, and your child does not need to be enrolled in that school or site to get meals. More information, including a list of sites, can be found at norwalkps.org.
- Information hubs are also being set up on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays at some NPS Summer Meals sites. Families can get free books from the Norwalk Public Library pop up truck, as well as information about Census, voter registration, Kindergarten registration, and more from community partners. 


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
