**Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus**

(NORWALK, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at [www.ct.gov/coronavirus](http://www.ct.gov/coronavirus). Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 12 p.m. on Saturday, August 1, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are no new positive cases reported in Norwalk, and the total positive reported cases remains at 2,125. There were no new deaths reported.
- Information about COVID-19 is always evolving. Luckily, there are many ways to find updated information. - As the Norwalk Office of Emergency Management keeps a close eye on Tropical Storm Isaias, they urge residents to prepare for hurricanes and future storms: make a plan, gather emergency supplies, prepare your car and home, and stay informed of weather alerts. 


## Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
