### Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(NORWALK, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 5 p.m. on Sunday, August 2, 2020:


- Since yesterday, there is 1 new positive case in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,126. There were no new deaths reported.
- Many are experiencing turnaround times of a week or more to receive test results. These delays are the result of increased infections and testing throughout the country and demand on the laboratories and testing supplies.
- Over the past month, teenagers and 20-29-year-olds have represented high numbers of new COVID-19 infections in Norwalk (see chart on next page for the data on cases per age group in July 2020).
- On Monday, August 3, the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) will host a special day to offer its services only to military veterans and individuals over the age of 65. - As the Norwalk Office of Emergency Management keeps a close eye on Tropical Storm Isaias, they urge residents to sign up for the City's CodeRED Emergency Alert Notification System to stay informed in any emergency (sign up at [norwalkct.org/codered](http://norwalkct.org/codered)).

"As our younger residents are out seeing friends and socializing after months of staying home and restricting their movements, I'd like to remind them they are still at risk of becoming sick and also infecting others," Mayor Rilling said. "There are safe ways to get together with your friends. Gather outside in small groups and stay six feet away from others. Don't forget your mask. Don't travel to other states with high infection rates unless it is essential. If you do have to travel to these states, you need to quarantine for 14 days when you return to Norwalk. We can keep ourselves, our community, and our families safe with these actions."


