Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(NORWALK, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at www.ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 5 p.m. on Monday, August 3, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are no new positive cases in Norwalk, and the total positive reported cases remains at 2,126. There were no new deaths reported.
- The City of Norwalk is preparing to respond to the potential impact of Tropical Storm Isaias as it approaches the area tomorrow. The heavy rainfall could cause road flooding, which will make driving hazardous. High winds are the biggest concern and may cause downed trees, wires and power outages. Businesses and residents must secure or remove all outdoor furniture and tents. For storm updates and resources to help prepare your home and family, visit www.norwalkct.org. Residents are also encouraged to sign up for the City's CodeRED Emergency Alert Notification System at norwalkct.org/codered.
- Residents in low lying areas who are concerned about their vehicle can park at the Yankee Doodle and Maritime garages at no charge, from 12pm (noon) on Tuesday until 12pm (noon) on Wednesday.
- The United States Coast Guard has urged the commercial and recreational maritime community to prepare for the upcoming storm. Recreational boaters should pull small boats out of the water and store or secure paddlecraft and safety gear. - Tropical Storm Isaias may impact the hours of certain outdoor COVID-19 testing locations. If you plan to visit a COVID-19 testing location tomorrow or Wednesday, contact the testing location prior to arrival.


"As the City prepares for Tropical Storm Isaias, we encourage our residents to do the same," Mayor Rilling said. "Be prepared for potential power outages. Fully charge mobile devices, batteries for medical equipment, and fill up your gas tank. Now is the time to secure or move outdoor furniture, propane tanks, planters and other lawn decorations. You should also make sure you have the basics in your home, including food and water."


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
