### Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(NORWALK, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at [www.ct.gov/coronavirus](http://www.ct.gov/coronavirus). Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 5 p.m. on Tuesday, August 4, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are no new positive cases in Norwalk, and the total positive reported cases remains at 2,126. There were no new deaths reported.
- The Town Clerk is advising that all absentee ballots be submitted to the drop box locations at City Hall and the Police Department. There have been delays with the Postal Service which may run the risk of mail-in ballots not being received on time in order to be counted.
- The City of Norwalk is responding to the impacts of Tropical Storm Isaias. The heavy rainfall has caused road flooding, which has made driving hazardous. High winds from the storm have caused many downed trees, wires, and an abundance of power outages throughout the City and surrounding areas. There will be a delay in restoring power due to the volume of outages and roadway obstacles. - The state of Rhode Island has been added to the list of impacted states. Delaware and Washington D.C. have been removed. The current states with travel advisories are now: AK, AL, AR, AZ, CA, FL, GA, IA, ID, IL, IN, KS, KY, LA, MD, MI, MO, MS, MT, NC, ND, NE, NM, NV, OH, OK, PR, RI, SC, TN, TX, UT, VA, WA, and WI. Anyone returning from any of the listed states are directed to quarantine for a 14-day period from the time of last contact within the identified state.


"As Tropical Storm Isaias continues, residents should remain indoors and take all proper safety precautions," Mayor Rilling said. "There are many downed trees, electrical wires, and power outages citywide. All power outages and safety hazards should be reported to the proper authorities immediately to ensure a response. Residents should be cautious of downed electrical wires, trees, and flooded areas to ensure their safety."


## Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
