## **Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus**

**(Norwalk, Conn.)** - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at [ct.gov/coronavirus](https://ct.gov/coronavirus). Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 2:00 p.m. on Monday, September 7, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are three new positive cases in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,182. There were no new deaths reported.
- On Tuesday, September 8, Norwalk City Hall will be open to the public by appointment only. Members of the public do not need to make an appointment to use the Tax Collector walk-up window outside of City Hall, or visit the Customer Service walk-up window inside City Hall. To schedule an appointment, members of the public are asked to call a department in advance. Face coverings are required. - Debris collection is continuing this week across the City, with approximately 40% of routes completed to date. There are 27 trucks out across Norwalk doing collections, and more than 1,800 tons of debris has been collected thus far. The collection will continue throughout this week, and may go into next week as well.
- Free COVID-19 community testing is available at the Day Street Community Health Center, 49 Day Street in Norwalk, Monday - Friday, 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. No appointment or referral is needed and testing is free. More information is available at [chc1.com](https://chc1.com).
- Due to COVID-19 health concerns, absentee ballot applications will be sent to all registered voters in Norwalk in the coming weeks. Absentee ballot applications should be returned to the Town Clerk's Office for processing. Once approved, the actual absentee ballot will be mailed to a voter. When completed, the ballot can be dropped off at secure drop boxes in Norwalk or mailed back to the Town Clerk's Office. Polling locations will also be open on Election Day for those who choose to vote in-person. More information is available at [norwalkct.org](https://norwalkct.org).



## Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection


Test results may be reported several days after collection. Does not include cases with missing specimen collection
