Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 9, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are no new positive cases in Norwalk, and the total positive reported cases remains 2,182. There were no new deaths reported.
- Norwalk City Hall is open by appointment only on weekdays during routine business hours. Members of the public do not need to make an appointment to use the Tax Collector walk-up window outside of City Hall, or visit the Customer Service walk-up window inside City Hall. To schedule an appointment, members of the public are asked to call a department in advance. Face coverings are required. For more information, visit norwalkct.org/appointments.
- Storm debris collection continues this week. To date, roughly 50% of routes have been collected across Norwalk. The Yard Waste Site is open weekdays from 7:30 a.m. - 3 p.m. and Saturdays from 7:30 a.m. - 2 p.m. A face covering and [Disposal Pass](#) is required.
- Mayor Harry Rilling and Lt. Governor Susan Bysiewicz [joined the Connecticut Food Bank](#) and hundreds of volunteers in Norwalk to help distribute nearly 50,000 meals today. Residents who may be food insecure can call 2-1-1 to be connected to local resources that can help.
- This Friday, September 11, the City will hold its annual 9/11 Remembrance Ceremony outside of City Hall, beginning at 8:30 a.m. Members of the public are invited to attend, and must follow COVID-19 health guidelines, including wearing face coverings.


“We are working as quickly as we can to remove debris around Norwalk. It is certainly taking longer than we wish, but there is simply a tremendous amount of material to collect from virtually every home and property. I appreciate the continued patience and cooperation from residents,” Mayor Rilling said. “I invite the public to attend our annual 9/11 Remembrance Ceremony on Friday. This solemn event honors the 14 Norwalk residents who died on September 11, 2001, and honors all victims and survivors of the 9/11 attacks. Please join us Friday morning for this special remembrance ceremony.”

Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection


Test results may be reported several days after collection. Does not include cases with missing specimen collection
