Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at ct.gov/coronavirus. Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, September 10, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are eight new positive cases in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,190. Two cases are recent, while six cases are from the previous week and reflect ongoing data analysis. There was one new death reported. Now, a total of 147 residents have died from coronavirus.
- The public is invited to attend the City of Norwalk [9/11 Remembrance Ceremony](#) tomorrow, September 11, at 8:30 a.m. outside of Norwalk City Hall. The event will be held rain or shine to honor the 14 residents who died on 9/11. Guests must wear face coverings.
- A free Household Hazardous Waste event for Norwalk residents is scheduled for this Saturday, September 12, 2020 in New Canaan. The event will be held at the New Canaan Wastewater Treatment Plant, 394 Main Street from 8 a.m. - 2 p.m. For a list of acceptable items, and the COVID-19 safety protocols in place, visit norwalkct.org.
- The public is reminded that the beaches in Norwalk no longer have lifeguards on duty. This is standard practice following the Labor Day holiday. The COVID-19 safety measures in place, such as parking and nonresident restrictions, remain in effect until further notice.
- The Norwalk Health Department and Norwalk Police Department continue spot checks and unannounced inspections of various Norwalk businesses and restaurants. Establishments found in violation of state and local public health orders may be fined or ordered to close. Members of the public can report issues regarding food establishments to the Norwalk Health Department at (203) 854-7776 and issues regarding other businesses to the Police non-emergency line (203) 854-3000.


“I am sorry to share the news that another one of our residents has died from coronavirus. I offer my thoughts and prayers to their loved ones during these difficult times. While our case numbers have been holding steady that does not mean the virus has disappeared. People are still becoming infected, getting seriously ill, and unfortunately, dying,” Mayor Rilling said. “We continue to monitor businesses for compliance with local and state guidelines. It is critically important that businesses and customers adhere to the rules which will help slow the spread of the virus in our community. Now is not the time to take anything for granted or relax the health and safety measures that we know are effective.”


Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
