## Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus

(Norwalk, Conn.) - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at [ct.gov/coronavirus](https://ct.gov/coronavirus). Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, September 13, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there are no new cases to report due to ongoing updates with the state Department of Health software system.
- Free COVID-19 community testing is available at the Day Street Community Health Center, 49 Day Street in Norwalk, Monday - Friday, 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. No appointment or referral is needed and testing is free. The public can also visit a mobile testing site this Thursday, September 17, from 9 a.m. - 12 p.m. at Grace Baptist Church, 17 West Avenue, in Norwalk. - The 2020 Census is nearing its deadline, and to help residents complete the form, mobile questionnaire assistance events are planned for this week in Norwalk. Those who have yet to complete the 2020 Census are invited to the following events: Monday, September 14, from 3 p.m. - 6 p.m. at the Roodner Court Learning Center, 261 Ely Ave.; Wednesday, September 16, from 3 p.m. - 6 p.m. at the Colonial Village Learning Center, 24 Monroe St.; Thursday, September 17, from 2:30 p.m. - 5:30 p.m. at the Nathaniel Ely Center, 11 Ingalls Ave.; and Friday, September 18, from 3 p.m. - 6 p.m. at the Meadow Gardens Learning Center, 49 Meadow St. Bilingual staff is available to assist and free masks will be provided to all who attend.
- Norwalk City Hall is open by appointment only on weekdays during routine business hours. Members of the public do not need to make an appointment to use the Tax Collector walk-up window outside of City Hall, or visit the Customer Service walk-up window inside City Hall. To schedule an appointment, members of the public are asked to call a department in advance. Face coverings are required. 

I’ve noticed more people utilizing the Customer Service Walk-up Window which is good to see. For those who need an appointment or wish to speak to staff, please give us a call. We are here to help.”


## Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
