## **Mayor Rilling Provides Local Update on Coronavirus**

**(Norwalk, Conn.)** - City officials are working closely with partners at the state and federal levels, as well as partners in Norwalk, to monitor and respond to COVID-19, the 2019 novel Coronavirus. Statewide updates can be found online at [ct.gov/coronavirus](https://ct.gov/coronavirus). Mayor Rilling provided the following Norwalk-area specific updates regarding COVID-19 coronavirus as of 5:30 p.m. on Monday, September 14, 2020:

- Since yesterday, there is one new positive case in Norwalk, bringing the total positive reported cases to 2,204. There were no new deaths reported.
- Keep Norwalk Beautiful is hosting a socially distanced river clean up on Saturday, September 19, from 9 a.m. - 12 p.m. Volunteers are asked to meet at 40 Cross Street and wear face coverings. Clean up supplies will be provided and space is limited. Register for this event ahead of time and find out more information by visiting [volunteer.kab.org](https://volunteer.kab.org).
- The Norwalk Transit District will be distributing free masks tomorrow, September 15, from 7 a.m. - 9 a.m. and again from 3 p.m. - 5 p.m. at the transit hub, 10 Burnell Blvd. in Norwalk. All are invited. Please practice social distancing if attending.
- Debris collection is continuing across the City, with approximately 75% of routes completed to date. There are numerous trucks out across Norwalk doing collections, and more than 450,000 pounds of debris has been collected thus far. The work should be completed this week.
- Free meal distributions are continuing across Norwalk through the end of 2020. A total of 10 sites will be operating through December 31, 2020, providing free meals for any school-aged child in Norwalk. The sites are open noon - 2 p.m. weekdays, and four sites (Brien McMahon High School, Columbus Magnet School, Nathan Hale Middle School, and West Rocks Middle School) offer additional hours from 3:30 p.m. - 5:30 p.m. For a complete list of locations and more information, visit [norwalkps.org](https://norwalkps.org).




## Number of Norwalk COVID-19 Cases by Date of Specimen Collection
